"We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Romans 6:4



The Bible Teaches...

- Baptism follows the example of Christ, who himself was baptized Mathew 3:13-17
- It shows obedience to the Biblical command for believers to be baptized. Acts 2:38
- Baptism is the means of giving public testimony of one's faith in Christ, and should take place as soon after salvation as possible.
 Acts 8:36-39 • Acts 16:30-34
- Baptism is the singular immersion of the believer in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It identifies us with the work of the Trinity in our salvation.
 Mathew 28:19
- Baptism is symbolic of Christ's death and resurrection. When we are immersed in the water, we are telling others that we desire to live a Christian life that will glorify Him. Baptism is the outward symbol of the inner spiritual work of salvation. Romans 6:3-6

What is Biblical Baptism?

Biblical baptism is by immersion. The

word "baptize" in Greek means "to dip,

plunge or sink," and is described by

Greek scholar, Dr. Wuest, as a

submarine going under the surface of

the water and coming back to the

surface. There were other Greek words

for sprinkling and pouring,

but they are never related to

baptism in the Bible. Baptism is not a

means of grace, salvation or receiving

the Holy Spirit.
